SUBJECT: RESOLUTION – AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE 2015 ESSEX COUNTY ALL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE.

WHEREAS, all of Essex County has exposure to natural hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment and the County's economy; and **WHEREAS**; pro-active mitigation of known hazards before a disaster event can reduce or

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eliminate long-term risk to life and property; and

WHEREAS, The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) established new requirements for pre- and post-disaster hazard mitigation programs; and

WHEREAS; a coalition of Essex County jurisdictions with like planning objectives has been formed to pool resources and create consistent mitigation strategies within Essex County; and

WHEREAS, the coalition has completed a planning process that engages the public, assesses the risk and vulnerability to the impacts of natural hazards, develops a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and creates a plan for implementing, evaluating and revising this strategy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township of West Caldwell:

- 1) Adopts in its entirety, the 2015 Essex County All Hazard Mitigation Plan Update (the "Plan") as the jurisdiction's Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan, and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertain to this jurisdiction.
- 2) Will use the adopted and approved portions of the Plan to guide pre- and post-disaster mitigation of the hazards identified.
- 3) Will coordinate the strategies identified in the Plan with other planning programs and mechanisms under its jurisdictional authority.
- 4) Will continue its support of the Mitigation Planning Committee as described within the Plan.
- 5) Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan.
- 6) Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations.
- 7) Will provide an update of the Plan in conjunction with the County no less than every five years.

SUBJECT: RESOLUTION – AUTHORIZING AN EXECUTIVE SESSION FROM WHICH THE PUBLIC IS EXCLUDED.

WHEREAS, The Township of West Caldwell (the “Township” or the “public body” has been duly created and is validly existing as a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey pursuant to applicable laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, The Township constitutes a “public body” as such term is defined in the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, constituting Chapter 231 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1975 of the State of New Jersey, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq. and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto (the “Open Public Meetings Act”); and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act permits a public body, as such term is defined therein, to exclude members of the public from portions of any “meeting”, as such term is defined therein including N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) et seq., under certain limited circumstances which include, but are not limited to, (a) a discussion of pending or anticipated litigation in which the public body is or

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may become a party, or (b) a discussion of any matters which fall within the attorney-client privilege, or (c) a discussion of a collective bargaining agreement including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof, or (d) a discussion regarding the purchase, acquisition or lease of real property with public funds or (e) a discussion of involving the employment, appointment or termination of employment of an existing or prospective public officer or employee; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Township has determined that and is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist that permit the governing body of the Township to discuss the matters set forth in this Resolution in executive session; and

WHEREAS, the matters set forth in this Resolution are within the exceptions and the limited circumstances set forth in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) et seq., the governing body of the Township desires to conduct a portion of the meeting in an executive session from which members of the public will be excluded.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST CALDWELL, in accordance with the provisions of The Open Public Meetings Act, that the governing body of the Township hereby determines to conduct a portion of the meeting in an executive session from which members of the public will be excluded in accordance with the provisions of Open Public Meetings Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforementioned executive session will be limited to matters relating to the following items and which matters involve, as applicable, pending and anticipated litigation involving or expected to involve the Township, matters which fall within the attorney-client privilege, matters regarding the discussion of a collective bargaining agreement, matters relating to purchase, acquisition or lease of real property with public funds or matters relating to personnel:

1. There were no closed session items.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the minutes of each executive session will be prepared and maintained by the Township and with regard to each of the matters discussed in executive session; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the minutes relating to a particular matter discussed will be made available to members of the public – (a) at such time as the matter no longer requires confidentiality as permitted by applicable laws, (b) upon the completion of a pending or anticipated litigation, or (c) upon such matter no longer falling within the attorney-client privilege, (d) upon the completion of a collective bargaining agreement including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof, or (e) upon the completion of a purchase, acquisition or lease of real property with public funds, or (f) as such disclosure may otherwise may be required by the Open Public Meetings Act.

Council President O’Hern requested that the township engineer name be corrected to Maser Consulting, PA on the Hazard Mitigation Plan for Resolution 9634.

It was regularly moved by Council President O’Hern, seconded by Councilman Cecere that the seven Resolutions be adopted.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:

There was no report.

PUBLIC WORKS & TECHNOLOGY:

Councilman Docteroff reported the following:

2. Capture Point trained recreation staff on January 23 on using the pool badge system that will be implemented this year. A letter was sent to residents suggesting they upload their own photos to be used on their pool badges.

1. A meeting was held with Mayor and Council of Caldwell. Mayor Tempesta, Councilmen Hladik and Docteroff and Administrator Brewer were in attendance to discuss sharing the turfing of Essex Valley School field.

A discussion was held on the Harrison School field and the timing of resurfacing the James Caldwell High School field.

HEALTH AND SHARED SERVICES:

Councilwoman Canale reported the following:

1. The Board of Health is meeting on Wednesday, February 4, 2015 at 7 pm.
2. Councilwoman Canale's father, Jack Kupcho, is receiving the New Jersey Department of Agriculture Award on February 4.

ADVISORS' REPORT:

Administrator Brewer reported that the Community Development Block Grant meeting that was to be held on January 29 concerning the Senior Transportation Bus was cancelled and will be rescheduled.

Township Attorney Jemas reported that at the January 20, 2015 Mayor and Council meeting, Mr. Geneslaw, Esq., Gibbons PC, who represents Stop and Shop and GR/GS Caldwell, stated that his appearance and comments, along with Mr. Scrivo's appearance and comments were not reported in the December 2, 2014 minutes. Mr. Jemas continued that the December 2, 2014 minutes did include Mr. Scrivo's appearance and his comments, along with Mr. Geneslaw's appearance and his comments. Mr. Geneslaw was made aware of the inclusion and he apologized for his remarks concerning the December 2, 2014 minutes.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Tempesta reported that Public Works has been working diligently on keeping the roads clean from snow with another salt delivery is expected today. Mayor Tempesta also reported that he made Essex County DPW aware of the poor condition of Passaic Avenue south of Bloomfield Avenue.

Mayor Tempesta reported that he will be attending the Mayors' Legislative Day February 4 in Trenton and will be speaking with legislators concerning the underfunded state pension system and the funded local pension system and the legislative efforts to combine the two systems. Mayor Tempesta stated he will be letting the legislators know of his disapproval of this legislation because of the potential to downgrade the Township's bond rating.
